Regular City Council Meeting of March 13, 2017

The City Council of the City of Princeton, Texas, met in regular session in the Council Chamber of City Hall on March 13, 2017 at 6:30 p.m.

The following Councilmembers were present: Councilmember David Kleiber, Councilmember Mike Guillen, Councilmember Nathan Council and Councilmember Steve Deffibaugh. Mayor John – Mark Caldwell and Mayor Pro-Tempore Rich Hooper were present. The following Staff Members were present: City Manager Derek Borg, Deputy City Secretary/PIO Tabatha Monk, Police Chief James Waters, Police Lt. Jesus Rodriguez, Public Works Director Tommy Mapp and Building Official Shawn Fort.

**Mayor Caldwell called the City Council Meeting to order at 6:30 PM.**

Mayor Caldwell called roll, present were Councilmembers **David Kleiber, Mike Guillen, Nathan Council and Steve Deffibaugh.** Mayor **John-Mark Caldwell** and Mayor Pro-Tempore **Rich Hooper.**

Councilmember **Deffibaugh** led the audience in the invocation.

Councilmember **Kleiber** then led the audience in the **Pledge of Allegiance.**

Mayor **Caldwell** then announced **Citizen Appearance.** No one spoke under citizens appearance.

Mayor **Caldwell** then announced the Consent Agenda: All consent agenda items listed are considered to be routine by the City Council and will be enacted by one motion. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a Councilmember so request, in which event the item will be removed from the Consent Agenda and considered in its normal sequence on the agenda. Councilmember **Council** made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda. Councilmember

**Kleiber seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.**

Mayor **Caldwell** then announced the first item under the Regular Agenda: **(2017-035)** "Moment of silence in memory of John Fleeman, Public Works Employee and Bill Baker, EDC Director." No action was needed.

Mayor **Caldwell** then announced the second item under the Regular Agenda: **(2017-036)** "Discussion and possible action regarding a preliminary plat from Astra Development for Brookside, 149.09 acre tract in the Hardin Wright Survey, Abstract 957." Councilmember **Deffibaugh** made a motion to approve. Councilmember **Guillen** seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Mayor **Caldwell** then announced the third item under the Regular Agenda: **(2017-037)** "Discussion and possible action regarding Resolutions from the Economic Development Corporation and the Community Development Corporation for the allocation of funds for a specific project to fund a Communications Specialist for the remainder of fiscal year 2017." Councilmember **Deffibaugh** made a motion to approve. Mayor Pro-Tempore **Hooper** seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.


Mayor **Caldwell** then announced the fourth item under the Regular Agenda: **(2017-038)** "Possible action to approve request for items to be placed on a future agenda and NOT for discussion of these requests". Councilmember **Deffibaugh** requested a briefing over traffic congestion on 380.

Mayor **Caldwell** then announced the Report Agenda: City Manager: **Derek Borg** spoke on the following items: Next meeting March 27, 2017 @6:30 p.m.


